You can paddle whitewater on the Stonycreek River; ride our byways; bicycle country lanes, mountain bike single-track and cycle rail-trails; hike atop our lush ridges; and boat, fish or swim in lakes once owned by steel companies.

- Mountain bike enthusiasts can ride the Inclined Plane Downhill Mountain Bike Trails - a thrilling trip to the bottom
- The Stonycreek River has the longest continuous set of rapids in the eastern U.S. - 15 Class III-IV rapids in 4 miles
- Bike or hike along **48 miles of The Ghost Town Trail** a historic 'rails to trails' named **Pennsylvania**'s **2020 Trail of the Year**

Johnstown has been most commonly known for its three floods - 1889, 1936, and 1977 - but did you know that Johnstown was also a canal port, a railroad center, and a steelmaking hub?

- Watch the Academy-Award winning film at the Johnstown Flood Museum
- The 1889 Flood was the worst natural disaster of the 19th century
  - See trains pass through the Gallitzin Tunnels - the highest and longest tunnels on the former Pennsylvania Railroad
  - The Allegheny Portage Railroad was part of the Underground Railroad
  - The first steel rails for the railroad were rolled in Johnstown's mills
  - At one time, western Pennsylvania produced nearly one-quarter of America's coal
